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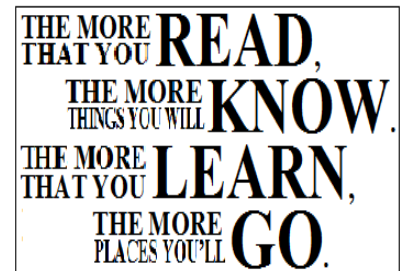

### SUGGESTIONS:

- ✓ Students take up DA (Detailed Assessment) throughout the academic session. Apart from this Remedial sheets are given and Misconceptions are addressed immediately after the teachers teach a concept. Key paper is discussed after every assessment. The student should practice Math for at least an hour every day to improve in the subject. Teachers will also come up with concept based extra problems as a worksheet during weekends.
- ✓ The School library is thronging with books of all genres for the students to read as well as borrow.
- ✓ The students from class III to IX appear for the online Detailed Assessment every month as well as the Gray Matters test at the beginning and the end of an academic session conducted by the IIT Alumni. These assessments are conducted across the country comparing the performance of our school students with the rest of the students in India and a complete report is given about each child which is handed over during the PTM. The assessments enhance the qualitative and quantitative analysis of the concepts learnt at school. The School does not take the responsibility of sending the students for any other Competitive Examinations. Interested students may appear for them on their own. Such students are encouraged as well as attended upon by the teachers during the preparation.

### CONCERNS:

- ✓ PSA and OTBA is conducted twice a year as a part of the Formative Assessments to encourage textbook reading and evaluate the logical, analytical as well as the comprehension. It is mandatory that the students should read the textbooks on a daily basis, even if no homework is given from them. This practice will enable the students to understand the lesson making it easier for them to prepare during a CT or any other assessment.
- ✓ Students often engage in activities like role play and dialogue writing to improve on conversation skills. Extensive reading is the best way to enhance the vocabulary.

## QUESTIONS:

- ✓ *Class photographs and Annual Day CDs will be handed over to the child along with the SA II Results. A circular will be issued shortly regarding the same.*
- ✓ *With high regards towards the safety and security of the students no excursions are planned at School. Students are only taken on field trips as and when the time permits.*

## HAPPENINGS TILL DATE

**SILVER JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS:** *Classes I to VIII celebrated the Silver Jubilee at Shilpa Kala Vedika on the 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> of December, 2015. Eminent personalities, Mr Rajendra Singh, Ms Farida Lambay and Shri Venkat Chengavalli honoured the occasion as the Chief Guests.*

**HINDU YOUNG WORLD QUIZ:** *Shraman and Aditya of class VI have brought laurels to the School by winning the 16<sup>th</sup> Edition, Hindu Young World Quiz held on the 30<sup>th</sup> of January, 2016. From the 11 teams (7 Senior Category and 4 Junior Category) that participated from the School, these two juniors edged past all the other teams leading by 95 points and emerged as winners against HPS, Begumpet. This is the Second Consecutive Year where the School students have been declared as winners in the Competition.*

**PREPRIMARY ANNUAL DAY:** *The tiny tots of the School celebrated their Annual Day on the 13<sup>th</sup> of February, 2016. The little ones enthralled their parents and teachers with their sweet smiles and colourful attires. The confidence with which they performed on the stage was a sight to behold.*

The parents and children joined in the auditorium to attend the career guidance session. **WORKSHOP FOR GIRLS:** *Dr. Parul Pareek, Director-ROPE, a Girl Teen Expert and Motivational Speaker conducted a workshop for the girl students of classes VI to IX where topics related to the physical psychological growth, adolescent health and positive youth development were discussed.*
